AGREEMENT FOR SUPPLY & DELIVERY OF MEDICAL DRUGS (LOT 2)

This Framework Agreement for the supply and delivery of Medical Drugs is made and entered into this 6th day of Sepetmber, A.D. 2021 by and between the Government of the Republic of Liberia, through the John F. Kennedy Memorial Medical Center, represented by its Chief Executive Officer, **Dr. Jerry F. Brown** (hereinafter known and referred to as the Purchaser and Lucky Pharmacy, a duly authorized Medical Drugs & Supplies distributor operating that the laws of the Republic of Liberia, represented by its General Manager, **Mr. Ramesh venkat** (hereinafter known and referred to as the Supplier /Contractor) now hereby

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the Center has budgetary allotment from the Government of Liberia and invalidation internally generated revenue to procure Medical Drugs to support its operations.

AND WHEREAS the Center, in keeping with law, has submitted a complete set of badding document in English to importers and distributors of Medical Drugs as a requirement day and a process of National Competitive Bidding (NCB)

AND WHEREAS after due process of bid evaluation, the Procurement Committee of a result the selection of the Supplier/Contractor as having the most competitive bid and has there are been awarded this contract for the supply and delivery of the said Medical Drugs (Lot 3). See bidding documents attached as **Exhibit A**);

AND WHEREAS The Contractor, in keeping with law, has submitted the following documentations as proof of its legal status:

- a) Business registration for the current year
- b) Tax Clearance valid for the last ninety days
- c) A Registered Member of PPCC Vendor Registry
- d) Certificate from the Pharmaceutical Board of Liberia

(See documents attached as Exhibit B)

AND WHEREAS the Contractor represents that it possesses the necessary contracts knowledge, ability and experience to implement this contract:

AND WHEREAS, the Contractor represents that neither it nor any of its officers, employeds or persons acting on its behalf have performed any of the following acts:

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- Attempted to influence the actions of John F. Kennedy Memorial Medical Control officials in connection with the award of this contract.
- Offered any inducements, rewards or anything of value to the Center's officials or employees or their relatives in connection with the award of this contract:

NOW THEREFORE the Medical Center and the Supplier/Contractor agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. DESCRIPTION OF GOODS

The Parties agree that the products to be supplied and delivered are **Medical Drugs** and will be available at all times without delay or hindrance.

2. CONTRACT VALUE AND PAYMENT TERMS

The parties agreed that the total value of this contract for (Lot 3) shall be One Hundren Three Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty United States Dollars 00/100 (US \$103,850.00) which is the Center's budgeted amount for goods stated herein as further referenced in the contract award letter.

The parties agreed that payments will be made against the Contractor's invoice for quantities supplied by an **Approved Purchase Order** from the Purchaser. All such payments are a made within thirty (30) days of the presentation of invoice. There will be no overlapping of the Medical Drugs under this contract.

The parties also agree that there will be no advance payments under this contract.

3. PRICE ADJUSTMENT

Prices quoted herein are subject to review where the Medical Drugs issued by the Color ware based on current market price. Prices will be adjusted whenever the Government of Liberia adjusts prices upwards or downwards. There shall, however be no adjustment without the express consent of the Center.

4. DURATION

The parties agree that this contract shall be for a period of Four (4) calendar Months beginning September 6, 2021 up to and including December 31, A.D. 2021.

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5. CONTRACT MODIFICATION OR EXTENSION

The parties agree that this contract may be modified in whole or in part only with the winter consent of both parties and under terms and conditions to be negotiated. Any sacri modifications shall be duly executed as an addendum, and may be requested by either party. The parties agree that no portion of this contract may be subcontracted to any other party except with the express written consent of the JFK Medical Center.


6. TERMINATION

- A. Contractor's Right to Terminate: If the Medical Center fails to pay the Contractor within a reasonable time any sums already certified by the Center, then the Contractor may, upon Thirty Five (35) business days' written notice to the Medical Center stop the supply and demand payment from the Center for all works completed to date. The parties agreed that presentation of an invoice shall constitute written notice.
- B. Medical Center's Right to Terminate: In the event the Contractor failed to sapple the products as requested by the Center's Purchase Order, the Center shall give which notice requiring the Contractor to supply within ten (10) business days. Should the Contractor refuse to comply with the Center's instruction and warning to correct the deviation(s), the Center, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies many terminate the contract, find another supplier and provide the products by whatever means the Center may deem expedient.

In the event of the Center's termination, any payment due the Contractor shall be withheld by the Center as liquidated damages incurred by the Center due to the Contractor's default.

- C. Center's Right to Terminate for Corrupt or Fraudulent Practices: The Center may without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by written notice of default sent to the Contractor, terminate the Contract in whole or in part of the Contractor, in the judgment of the Center has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in executing the Contract. For the purpose of this clause:
 - i. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution; and
 - ii. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract, and meatices

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collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the benefits of free and open competition.

- D. Center's Right to Terminate for Insolvency: The Center may at any time terminals the Contract by giving written notice to the Contractor, without compensation to the Contractor, if the Contractor becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy will be have accrued or will accrue thereafter to the Center.
- E. Center's Right to Terminate for Convenience: The Center, by written notice sent to the Contractor, may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for it-convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination be for the Center's convenience, the extent to which performance of the Contractor under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes arrived. Any supplies that are complete and ready for payment shall be accepted by the center at the Contract terms and prices based on the Government of Liberia adjusted prices.

7. FORCE MAJEURE

In the event of force majeure due to acts of God, civil war or disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of the parties that make the performance of this Contract impossible, the Commact shall be suspended for the said period of force majeure to be resumed as soon as erroms there can allow. In any such case, the duration of the contract shall be negotiated to compens to the period of suspension.

8. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Contract and the attachments hereto made constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter hereunder, and supersedes any and all oral statement discussions, representations or agreements made by either party to the other.

9. ENFORCEABILITY

Failure on the part of either party to enforce any provision of this Contract shall not be construed as a general waiver or relinquishment of the right to enforce such provision of the provision shall be held unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall in no way be affected thereby, and shall remain binding on the Parties





10. NOTICE

All notices, requests, consents and other communication hereunder shall be writing in rangins and shall be forwarded by either registered mail, facsimile, email or hand delivered to the address of each Party as follows:

11. TAXES AND DUTIES

The Contractor shall be responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, or other forms of payments due to the Government of Liberia under this contract.

12. BINDING EFFECT

This Contract shall remain binding on the Parties herein and their successors and assets they were herein specifically named.

13. GOVERNING LAW

This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the Republic of Liberia.
