Background

The Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission (LACC) principal functions are set out in the Act to Establish the Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission (LACC). In summary, they are:

- To lead the implementation of the Anti-Corruption strategy of Liberia
- To investigate corrupt conduct in the public sector
- To prosecute corrupt conduct in the public sector
- To actively prevent corruption in public sector institutions, and
- To educate the citizens and public sector about corruption and its effects.

The jurisdiction of the LACC extends to all public sector agencies in Liberia and employees, including government departments, local councils, members of parliament, ministers, the judiciary and the government. The LACC's jurisdiction also extends to those performing public official functions.

The Mission of LACC is to prevent, address and reduce corruption in the public and private sectors and to promote good governance, integrity and the rule of law.

VISION

The LACC is by law, the lead governmental agency in addressing and preventing corruption. However, it cannot succeed without strong and broad-based partnerships with every official and every citizen at the community, national, regional and international levels.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission of LACC is to prevent, address and reduce corruption in the public and private sectors and to promote good governance, integrity and the rule of law.

1.0 Introduction and Summary

AGREEMENT FOR PRINTING AND BINDING SERVICES

This Agreement made and entered into on or about this 1st day of July, 2022 between the Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission (the "Purchaser") and Electronic Communication Consultancy Services (E-Comsult) (hereinafter referred to as "the Printer").

WHEREAS, the Purchaser desires to engage the Printer to provide printing and binding services, which are set forth in the Bidding Document dated April 21st, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Printer has submitted a proposal dated May 23rd. 2022 to provide such services and represents that it is qualified by training and experience to perform the required services in the manner and on the terms and conditions set forth herein;

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual promises and undertakings contained herein. the parties hereto covenant and agree as follows;

ARTICLE I

- A. (Printer) shall provide the required services in accordance with the terms. conditions, specifications, and scope of the work set forth in:
 - 1. The Bidding Documents dated April 21st, 2022;
 - 2. The Printer's proposal received and reviewed; and
 - 3. The Standard Terms and Conditions of the Purchaser.

The aforementioned documents are hereby incorporated by reference into this contract as if set forth in their full text herein.

- B. In the event that there exists a conflict in terms, conditions, specifications, or scope of work between the Bidding Document and the Printer's proposal, the provisions of the Bidding Document, the Standard Terms and Conditions and this Agreement shall prevail.
- C. The Purchaser and the Printer each reserve the right to terminate this contract, provided written notice has been given to the other party at the address set forth at least thirty (30) days prior to such proposed termination date.

ARTICLE II

A. It is expected that up to about \$ 39, 600.00 (thirty nine thousand, six hundred) United States Dollars' worth of printing and binding services may be procured within the contract period.

- B. In full consideration of all services to be performed under this Agreement. (Printer) shall be compensated in accordance with the pricing schedule set forth in its bid proposal submitted May 23rd, 2022.
- C. Invoices must be submitted to the Purchaser before any payments will be made to (Printer). Invoices shall be submitted after the any services have been performed under this Agreement.
- D. It is the responsibility of the Purchaser to ascertain that services have been performed in a proper and satisfactory manner in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement prior to the approval of such invoices.
- E. The Printer shall be compensated for actual services performed and disbursements made in accordance with the terms of this ARTICLE.

ARTICLE III

A. This Agreement shall commence as of July 1st, 2022 and continue in full force and effect until December 31st, 2022 except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT FOR PRIVATE SECURITY GUARD SERVICE

This Agreement is made and entered into this 14th day of January A.D. 2022 by and between the LIBERIA ANTI-CORRUPTION COMMISSION (LACC), represented by its Executive Chairperson, Cllr. Edwin Kla Martin of the city of Monrovia, Republic of Liberia, hereinafter known and referred to as 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' and the ELSEAN ENTERPRISE Inc., represented by its Administrative Manager, Mr. George S. Berrian of the city of Monrovia, Republic of Liberia, aforesaid, hereinafter known and referred to as "PARTY OF THE SECOND PART".

WITNESSETH

- 1. That "PARTY OF THE SECOND PART" has represented that it has the necessary and required capability and logistics to provide professional, efficient and resourceful security services within the length and breadth of the Republic of Liberia;
- 2. That 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' is Government-Owned Agency established through legislative enactment which gives the power and authority to enter into contract and conduct any business by lawful means;
- 3. That 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' and "PARTY OF THE SECOND PART" hereby agree, covenant and stipulate that "PARTY OF THE SECOND PART" serves as security for 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART'.
- 4. That "PARTIES" herein indicated further mutually agree that 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' undertakes the following duties and perform the following responsibilities:
 - a. Provide Thirty (30) officers regarded as "standing post officer" for the protection of the properties, and personnel of 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' during the entire period of this contract.
 - b. That the assigned officers as indicated in section 4(a) of this contract shall unconditionally be responsible to protect the assets and personnel of 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' at all times.
 - c. That 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' shall hence forth provide protection for 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' in accordance with the Security Post Order prepared/approved by 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' which is attached hereto and made an integral part of this Agreement

Security Post Order – a specific instruction from the client regarding areas of security concern or deployment of guards and their functions.

5. That 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' and 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' shall conduct inventory of assets of 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART', and allow the inspection of the premises to enhance loss prevention;

That in case of loss/theft and or damages to the assets of the 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' as a result of security lapses or negligence the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' shall replace or make restitution of the value of the lost/damaged item(s) taking into consideration depreciation cost, and that such restitution be made within 30 days.

- 6. That Officers of 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' are restricted and limited to without the knowledge and consent of the 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' contrary to the "Security Post Order" referred to in 4(c) shall be imputed as negligence against the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART'.
- 7. The duration of this contract shall be for the period of one (1) month, pending the passage of the Fiscal Year 2022 Government of Liberia National Budget, beginning the 14th day of January, A.D. 2022 and ending the 31st day of January, A.D. 2022.
- 8. That in consideration of the service to be rendered by the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' to 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART', 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' shall pay or cause to be paid to the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' a monthly fee of US\$245.00 (Two Hundred Forty Five United States Dollars) per guard, Thus, the 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART' shall pay or cause to be paid to the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' one month service charge of US\$7,350.00 (Seven Thousand Three Hundred Fifty United States Dollars) for thirty (30) assigned officers who shall provide a 24 hour security guard service for the entire premises of LACC ('PARTY OF THE FIRST PART') located at Congo Town, in the City of Monrovia, Liberia as well as homes of the Executive Chairperson, all Commissioners and the Executive Director of the LACC located in the City of Monrovia or its environs.
- 9. The Terms of payment of the service charge indicated in count (8) shall be as follow:
 - a. The payment shall be made upon the submission of a completion of service certificate; approved by the Executive Director of the LACC.
 - b. The 'PARTY OF THE FIRST PART', in the case of force majeure that may result to delay in payment or inability to pay, the 'PARTY OF THE SECOND PART' a written notice no later than seven (7) working days from the incident of the force majeure stating the basis of the force majeure and its foreseeable consequences.

- 12. The Parties herein mutually agree that the execution of this 14th of January A.D. 2022 agreement necessarily voids and nullifies all and any other previous agreement.
- 13. It is further understood and agreed upon by the Parties hereto, that the terms and conditions of this agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the Parties hereto, their heirs, administrators, successors-in office, and assigns during the full and complete period herein granted as if they affixed their signatures hereto.

AGREEMENT FOR THE SUPPLY OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

This Agreement is made and entered into this 1st day of May 2022 between **The Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission** (hereinafter called "the Purchaser") and **Conex Energy Liberia**, a corporation incorporated und the laws of the Republic of Liberia and having its principal place of business at King street, Buzzy Quarters, U.N. VEHICLE SALE AGREEMENT

THIS VEHICLE SALE AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 1st day of July A.D. 2022.

BY AND BETWEEN

The LIBERIA ANTI-CORRUPTION COMMISSION (LACC) an agency of the Government of Liberia existing under the laws of Liberia with its head office at Tubman Boulevard. Congo Town in the city of Monrovia, hereinafter known and referred to as "BUYER".

AND

The Management of CICA MOTORS (LIBERIA) Inc., a business entity registered according to law and doing business in Liberia with its head office at U.N Drive, Sayon Town. Bushrod Island hereinafter known and referred as the "SELLER"

REFERENCE

The following documents shall be deemed to form and be read and construed as part of this Agreement:

- (a) the Tender Form and the Price Schedule submitted by the Bidder;
- (b) the Schedule of Requirements;

This sale agreement concerns the supply and delivery of two (2) motor vehicles terms and conditions hereunder provided to govern the conduct of business between the parties hereto.

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, the Buyer (LACC) desires to purchase two vehicles under a contract through a competitive bidding process:

WHEREAS, the buyer, after careful evaluation of the bid documents awarded the seller herein the contract for the supply of the vehicles.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the payment to be made by the Buyer to the Seller as herein mentioned, the seller hereby covenants with the buyer to provide the vehicle herein in conformity with the provisions of this Agreement.

PAYMENT TERM

Fifty percent (50%) payment shall be made to the seller by the Buyer prior to the supply of the vehicles and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be paid upon delivery of vehicles by the Seller to the Buyer.

DELIVERY OF VEHICLES

Seller shall deliver the acquired vehicles and Buyer shall inspect the vehicles and thereafter indicate their approval of the delivery on the delivery note which accompanied the vehicles, following which the Buyer shall take possession of acquired vehicles at Buyer premises on or before 30th October A.D. 2022. The seller further agreed that the Toyota Hiace shall be delivered by the First week in September 2022 while the Toyota Prado 4.0 SUV shall be delivered on or before October 30, 2022

CONVEYANCE OF TITLE

Seller shall convey title upon delivery of the vehicles to Buyer. Seller agrees and covenants to execute all documents which are necessary to finalize transfer of title and registration upon the acquired vehicles to Buyer.

WARRANTIES

Seller hereby expressly gives three (3) years or 100,000 km (one hundred thousand kilometers) warranty, which ever precedes the other, on vehicles supplied to the Buyer under this agreement.

SEVERABILITY

In the event any provision of this Agreement is deemed to be void, invalid or unenforceable, that provision shall be severed from the remainder of this Agreement. All remanding provisions of this Agreement shall then continue in full force and effect. If any provision shall be deemed valid due to its scope or breath, such provision shall be deemed valid to the extent of the scope and breadth permitted by law.

This Agreement shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the Republic Liberia.
