Subject: "NO OBJECTION" TO USE FRAMEWORK CONTRACT AGREEMENT TO AWARD CONTRACT TO SUPER PETROLEUM FOR THE SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (DIESEL/GASOLINE) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022

We present our compliments and wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter which sought the approval of the Commission for the **Liberia National Police** to award a framework contract to Super Petroleum for the supply and delivery of petroleum products (Diesel/Gasoline) in the amount of six hundred eighty-five thousand United States Dollars **US\$685,000.00**.

The Commission, upon review of your submissions, highlights the following:

- That the Liberia National Police submitted (Hard copies) including: <u>bid documents</u>, <u>bid evaluation report</u>, <u>procurement committee meeting minutes</u>, <u>bid opening minutes</u>, <u>etc.</u>;
- That LNP's BEP Report indicates that six (6) were invited to participate in the bidding process (Aminata and Sons, Inc., Super Petroleum Corporation, Srimex, Petroleum Plus Inc., Nexium Petroleum Limited, and Kailondo Petroleum) and only one bidder responded to the invitation (Super Petroleum Corporation);
- That LNP's BEP Report shows that Super Petroleum Corporation was deemed the most responsive for the preliminary, technical and financial evaluation;
- That Super Petroleum Corporation emerged as the lone successful winner.

The Commission, upon overall review of your submission renders "No Objection" for the **Liberia National Police** to award a framework contract to **Super Petroleum Corporation** for the supply of the goods as indicated above and in the stipulated monthly amount not to exceed fifty-seven thousand eighty-three United States Dollars and thirty-three cents **US\$57,083.33**.

Kindly be reminded that all contracts which cumulative annual value exceeds the threshold of **US\$250,000.00** must be signed by the Minister responsible for Finance and attested to by the Minister responsible for Justice.

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission admonishes and deems it a priority that you remain, **primarily**, in compliance with the PPCA, 2010, as we jointly aspire to achieve Transparency, Accountability, Fairness, Equality and ultimately public confidence in our procurement and concessions processes.

Ref. Request for No Objection to enter into Framework Agreement/Contract

Dear Atty. Kowo:

We present our compliments and write to inform you that the Liberia National Police has conducted it Restricted Bidding process toward the award of contract for the supply of Petroleum Products to the Entity (IFB No. LNP/SBA/RB/001/2022 value at Six Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand United States Dollars(US\$685,000.00) as allotted for 2022 Fiscal Year.

The Liberia National Police therefore request "No Objection" from the Commission of its intent to enter into framework agreement/contract with Super Petroleum for Supply of Petroleum Product to the Liberia National Police. Please see the attached relevant document.

This request in compliance with Section 31 of the PPC Act which states that except in the case of emergency and with the prior approval of the Commission, the Procurement Committee shall deliver to the Commission a notice of intent to award a contract exceeding the Thresholds as establish by Regulations promulgated by the Commission. No Procuring Entity shall enter into a procurement contract above the Thresholds establish by Regulations promulgated by the Commission unless a minimum of fourteen (14) days have lapsed since the notification of intend to award a contract was delivered to the Commission. The Commission shall cause a notice of intent to award a contract whose contract price exceeds the Thresholds in the Regulation to be published within two (2) business days of receipt of such notice. A procuring Entity may award a contract whose contract price is less than the Thresholds in the Regulation without notice to the Commission and passage of the a minimum of fourteen (14) days as provided in this subsection (1)

The Commission may request the procuring Entity to furnish supporting documentation demonstrating compliance with the provisions of this Act.
