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#### 1.0 Introduction and Summary

In keeping with Section 27(g) and 43(9), of the Amended and Restated Public Procurement and Concession Act which requires each Procuring Entity to submit quarterly report to the Commission, I am pleased to submit the Procurement Report for the 1st Quarter of 2023 Fiscal Year, for your review and consideration.

During the period under review, the National Investment Commission succeeded in receiving the approved provisional plan from PPCC. The Commission is still processing the tendering process of the four (4) procurement packages that were approved by PPCC. The process is ongoing to secure contracts for said packages.

Out of the four (4) procurement packages for implementation thus far, three (3) packages are being acquired through Request For Quotation (RFQ) method; namely, 1. Stationery, Petroleum Products, and Internet Provider Services. One (1) package is also being acquired through Restricted Bidding (RB) method, namely, 1. Security Guard Services. Which went through retendering to complete its processing. Also, two (2) Procurement Committee meetings were held.

#### 2.0 Challenges

Budget allocation support and signing of our contracts are the major challenges we encountered during the course of the quarter while implementing planned procurement activities.

#### 3.0 Recommendations

To effectuate our work in improving future implementation of planned procurement activities, we recommend that Management prevails on Ministry of Finance and Development Planning for budget support in order for us to fully implement our approved planned packages.
