Subject: REQUEST FOR "NO OBJECTION" TO AWARD CONTRACT

The Management of the National Port Authority (NPA) extends its compliments and writes to Request for "NO OBJECTION" to award contract to Saksouk Shopping Center for the supply of Scratch Cards under the contract package IFB NO. NPA /RB/001/2023.

This request is consistent with Section 31 (1) of the PPCA, the Act states that "Except in the case of emergency and with the prior approval of the commission, the Procurement Committee shall deliver to the Commission a notice of intend to award a contract exceeding the threshold as established by the Regulations promulgated by the Commission. Subject: REQUEST FOR "NO OBJECTION" TO AWARD CONTRACT TO SAKSOUK SHOPPING CENTER FOR THE SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF SCRATCH CARDS.

We present our compliments and wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter which sought the approval of the Commission for the National Port Authority to award Contract to Saksouk for the supply and delivery of Assorted Scratch Cards for FY 2023, in the amount of **US\$207,440** (two hundred seven thousand four hundred forty United States dollars, in accordance with Section 40 (3) of the PPCA, 2010 and Section 55(d).

Please note that all contracts which cumulative annual value above the threshold of **US\$250,000.00** must be signed by the Minister responsible for Finance and attested by the Minister responsible for Justice.
